Arthur "Art" C. Farrington, Jr., 70 of Owings, MD, passed away peacefully surrounded by love, Tuesday, February 19, 2019, at Calvert Health Medical Center.

Art was born in Syracuse, NY, on January 29, 1949, to the late Arthur and Frances Farrington. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Donna [Pitts] Farrington, and his daughters Betty Goldstein and her husband Scott, and Wendy White; sisters Patricia Fiorini and Kristen Mulcahy; brothers Ronald Farrington and Mark Farrington; granddaughters Jessica Levine and Sandra Goldstein; grandsons Gabriel White and Tristen White; and stepmother Jacqueline Farrington. After retirement, Art and Donna made their home in Maryland, where he continued serving the Air Force as a civilian employee for another 16 years.
