

## UPDATE: Tyler Andrew Rose Found Deceased; Family Gives Statement

**UPDATE FROM THE ST. MARY'S COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE:** After an extensive search, Tyler Andrew Rose, was located deceased. The St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office wishes to thank the Maryland State Police, the Prince George's County Police Department, and the Calvert K-9 Search Team for their assistance in the search.

We will provide more details if they become available.

**UPDATE:** The following message was posted by a family member of Tyler Rose earlier this evening:

"It's with a heavy heart and great sadness that we share that my brother, Tyler Rose has passed away. We want to thank everyone who has shared our posts, lifted us in prayer and reached out to support our family. The response from the St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office, Calvert County Search and Rescue teams, and K-9 units from surrounding counties was nothing short of phenomenal in their response to find my brother. We are absolutely heartbroken and are trying to process everything at this time.

Tyler was an amazing brother, father, nephew, son, grandson and friend with the biggest heart. He was fiercely loyal with the kindest soul. His work ethic and drive to provide for his family was beyond admirable. I was always in awe of how he took care of Kaitlyn and Emma everyday. Even though he was my little brother, he taught me so much. We will forever love you Tyler...until we see you again."

We are expecting additional details to be provided from the police soon.

**MECHANICSVILLE, Md.** -- The St. Mary's County Sheriff's Office is seeking the whereabouts of Tyler Andrew Rose, age 30 of Mechanicsville. Rose is classified as critically missing and is believed to be armed with a handgun. Rose is a white male, 6'1" and weighs 190 pounds with red hair and blue eyes. Rose was last known to be in the Golden Beach area of Mechanicsville on foot.
