

Calvert commissioners preside over ribbon cuttings

Calvert County Government officials, including three commissioners, visited two Prince Frederick businesses with new locations Tuesday, June 11. The local government entourage welcomed the new businesses and helped them mark the occasions with ribbon cutting ceremonies.

The first visit was to Superior Fireplace and Garage Door Inc. on Cutter Court, which is located within the Calvert County Industrial Park. Later the county government officials stopped by Rejuvenation Medi-Spa and Dr. Gail Anderson's Office at 131 Main Street.

Ashley Donnelly, one of the owners of Superior Fireplace and Garage Door Inc., explained the company opened in 2010 and subsequently relocated to the Industrial Park location late last year. Donnelly said the company decided to hold off the celebration until spring since they were extremely busy during the cold weather season. Donnelly's partners are her husband Dane and her father, Kurt Evers. The company has five other employees.
