On Tuesday, Oct. 1 the Calvert County Commissioners did something the board's current president says he loves to do—they got out of their meeting room and celebrated the openings of two new local businesses.

“Thank you for moving to this county,” said Commissioners' President Pat Nutter [R] to Mattie and Tyler Stott of Angels of Care. The Stott's business' specialty is in-home senior care.
